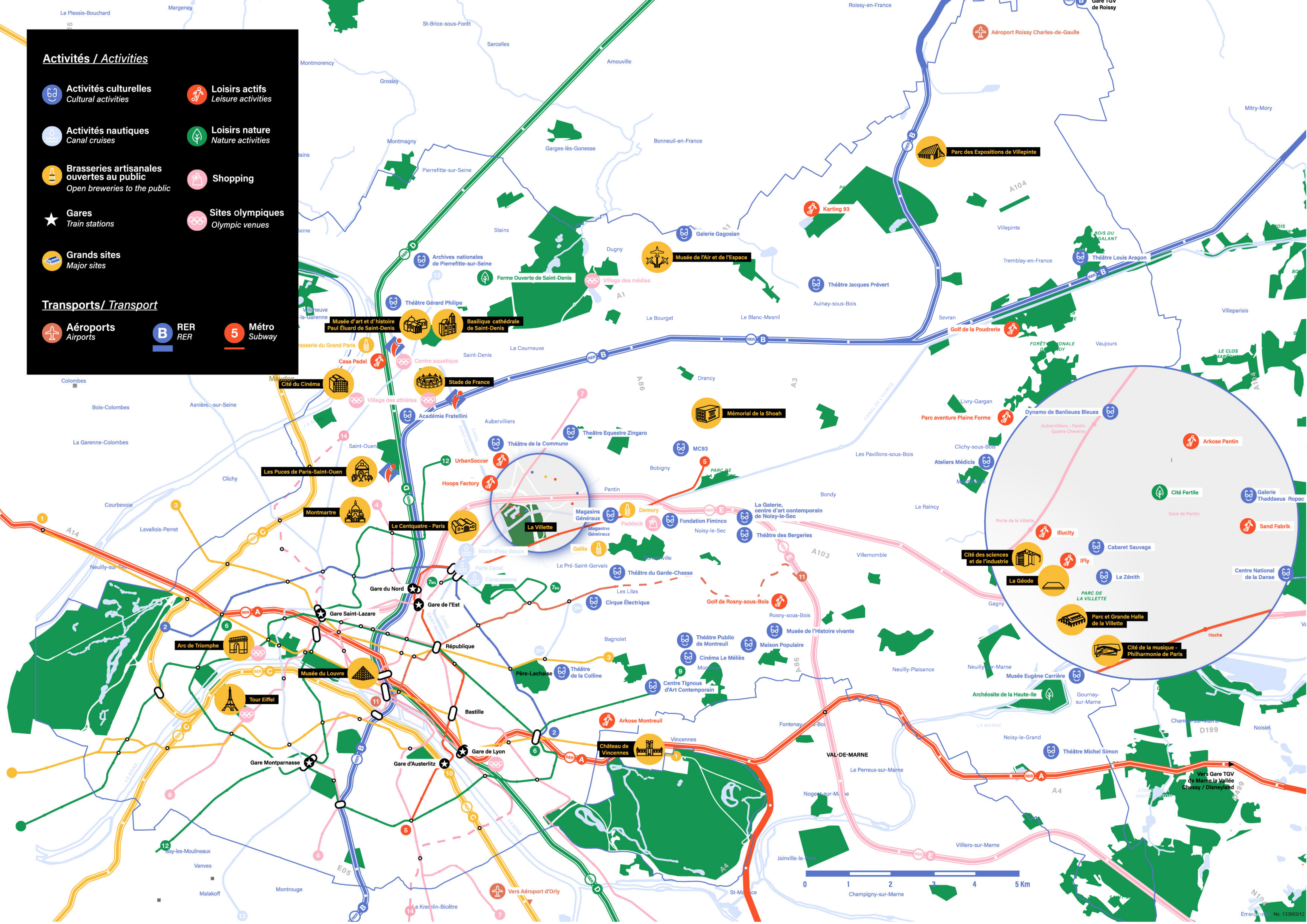

EDITORIAL

SEINE-SAINT-DENIS: WHERE COMMUNITY AND INNOVATION COMBINE TO CAPTURE THE WORLD'S IMAGINATION.

Most new facilities built for the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games are in Seine-Saint-Denis, providing a unique opportunity to take a fresh look at everything the *département* has to offer.

Energy-efficient, eco-responsible, multicultural, and mutually supportive, Seine-Saint-Denis offers an exciting glimpse of the future. Far from worn-out stereotypes, this is where the society of tomorrow is being shaped today.

The home of workers' housing, Seine-Saint-Denis is also a centre for visual arts and contemporary creation, boasting several world-class collections and galleries.

Final resting place of many of France's kings, the Basilica of Saint-Denis, one of the world's earliest Gothic structures, shares the skyline with works by contemporary architects including Oscar Niemeyer, Ricardo Bofil, Iwona Buczkowska, Rudi Ricciotti and the Perret brothers.

Home to a proud working-class tradition, its rapidly changing brownfield sites are fertile ground for artists' residences, experimental urban farms, and a lively night scene.

One of the cradles of the urban art scene, its walls are an open-air canvas for graphic designers and hip-hop artists, many of whom will be in the spotlight at the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games, where breakdancing will be an official competition for the first time.

A hub of resourcefulness and the pursuit of excellence, Seine-Saint-Denis is home to hundreds of craft specialists working with recovered materials, along with prestigious French luxury brands, the art workshops of public cultural establishment RMN-Grand Palais, and the stores of France's industrial design museum, CNAM.

Known for its thrilling outdoor spaces, including some fantastic urban parks just minutes from Paris, and France's first urban market-gardening facility, its network of waterways and hundreds of cycle paths make it a top slow tourism destination.

A site of national remembrance for the Shoah and the death transports centred on the Cité de la Muette in Drancy and the former deportation station in Bobigny, Seine-Saint-Denis is also where more than 150 languages are spoken by a welcoming, open-minded community that is forging a model of co-existence for the future.

A source of youth and energy for northeast Paris, Seine-Saint-Denis is a rapidly changing area with a wealth of life stories to tell, making it a must-see destination for visitors to Paris.

"Été du Canal" now offers many fun activities such as music, street art, party cruises, sports, and more. It is a highly anticipated event that showcases the cultural richness of the Greater Paris region.

Besides a packed programme of arts-based activities, "Été du Canal" strives to be a force for good in society. An inclusive and pioneering festival, its diverse range of events are free for all, making this an excellent opportunity for people of all ages to come together and for residents, artists and visitors from different backgrounds to share a unique experience.

River shuttles connect events along the Ourcq Canal for €1 or €2, while street art, local heritage, musical and fun cruises offer a fresh perspective on life along these ever-changing canals.

"L'Été du Canal" spotlights the cultural and recreational potential of the city's waterways. Long-neglected towpaths are being turned into thriving districts, quaysides transformed into open-air museums, and canal embankments on the outskirts of towns into vast water parks. "L'Été du Canal" takes a fresh approach to public spaces, proving that canals can be dynamic spaces where culture, leisure and nature coexist.

Canals will be central to the Paris 2024 celebrations: Ourcq Canal runs close to Club France, a vast village in La Villette Park for French sports federations and international delegations, and Saint-Denis Canal will link Club France to the Stade de France and the Aquatics Centre (OAC).

A tourist showcase for the Greater Paris region, this website, which specialises in guided tours and city walks, recently celebrated its fifth birthday with over 275,000 visitors.

A window onto Paris and the surrounding area, the groundbreaking #ExploreParis website takes a more human, diverse and responsible approach to tourism. Supported by the signatories of the Contrat de destination*, #ExploreParis now plans to expand its activities to the rest of France and the world.

A PEOPLE-CENTRED APPROACH: GREATER PARIS WITHIN EVERYONE'S REACH

The first tourism booking website for the Greater Paris region, launched in 2018, this innovative platform is revolutionising tourism and leisure practices and opening up exciting new opportunities.

This e-store has offered guided tours of Paris and three of the départements closest to the capital for five years. It focuses on sites and activities off the beaten tourist track, revealing another side of the capital on visits with themes like "The River City", "The Cosmopolitan City", "Urban Farms", "Nature in the City", "Arts and Crafts", "Art in the City", and offers people the chance to explore Paris like a local. It's an opportunity for everyone to have fun and meet residents as they explore a new neighbourhood.

#ExploreParis is also an outstanding example of how the Greater Paris region reaches out to local residents and offers dozens of daily tours showing Paris in a completely new light. It's another way to explore the metropolis, go behind the scenes of the city and discover its lesser-known sights.

The secret of its success? Hundreds of professional guides, private individuals, public bodies, socially committed community volunteers, and project leaders who love their city and what they do and like nothing better than to share it with others. Reasonable rates also put their services within everyone's reach, with prices suited to all pockets, from budget tours to free visits!

#EXPLOREPARIS: THE ADVENTURE HAS ONLY JUST BEGUN

Building on its success and visibility, the #ExploreParis website plans to capitalise on its status as a "new tourism" leader in the Greater Paris region. In step with the times, it transforms tourism into an unforgettable eco-responsible experience by putting the city back into the hands of its residents and opening up new horizons to visitors from around the world.

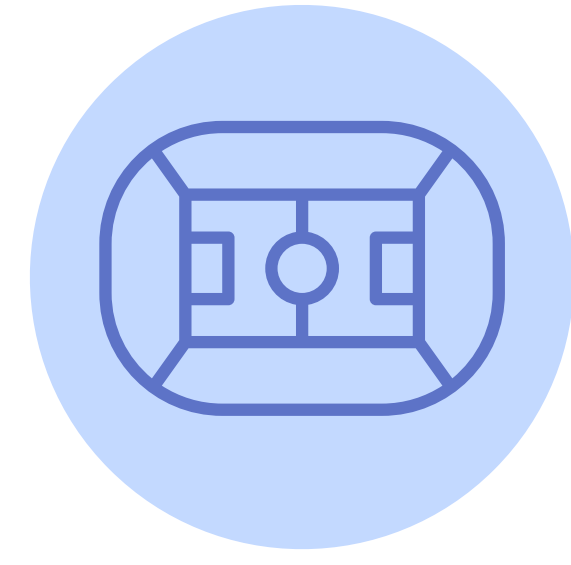
COUNTDOWN TO THE PARIS 2024 OLYMPIC GAMES

The Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games start on 26 July 2024. France, Paris and, most of all, Seine-Saint-Denis will enjoy a front-row seat at the most eagerly awaited sports event of the year.

Let's take a closer look at the top Olympic venues in Seine-Saint-Denis and how Paris 2024 is transforming its neighbourhoods. Each new building is designed to leave a lasting legacy for residents, from its legendary stadium to its brand-new Olympic venues.



SEINE-SAINT-DENIS TOURISME EVENTS



FRANCE'S BIGGEST STADIUM: AT THE HEART OF THE ACTION

This internationally famous stadium was built 26 years ago to host the 1998 Football World Cup. Show business and sports stars have developed a special connection with the **Stade de France** – one that's expected to grow even stronger during the Games when athletic and para-athletic events and seven-a-side rugby matches are held in the venue before crowds of 80,000 people. Two footbridges have been built to link the Stadium to two new districts: Plaine Saulnier, the site of the Aquatics Centre, and Franc-Moisin.

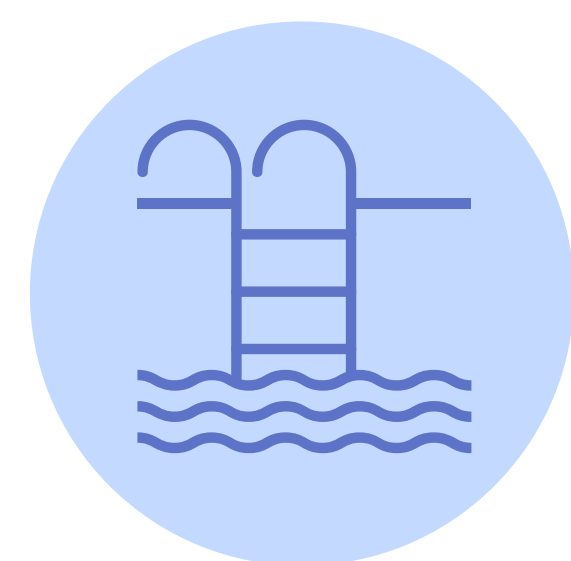
TWO OLYMPIC VILLAGES TO WELCOME THE WORLD

Fifteen thousand athletes will stay in the **Athletes' Village** during the Games, spread across three districts – Saint-Denis, Saint-Ouen and L'Île-Saint-Denis – chosen for their proximity to key event venues. From March to October, Paris 2024 will take over these renovated spaces, temporarily turning the Cité du Cinéma into the athletes' restaurant and the Halle Maxwell into a reception area for athletes. The Village Square is where officials, athletes' families and accredited media can access exceptional facilities such as sponsored areas, cafés, and tourist information points. After the Games, the Village will be retrofitted and handed over to its new residents and tenants, including the Ministry of the Interior.

The **Media Village** will also play a vital role in the area's transformation. Just a few hundred metres from the Air and Space Museum, in the districts of Dugny, Le Bourget and La Courneuve, it will accommodate some 2,500 journalists and technicians close to Le Bourget Exhibition Centre, where television and radio studios from around the world will be based. After the Games, the accommodation will be transferred to Seine-Saint-Denis residents. More housing will be built in 2025, creating a brand-new neighbourhood.

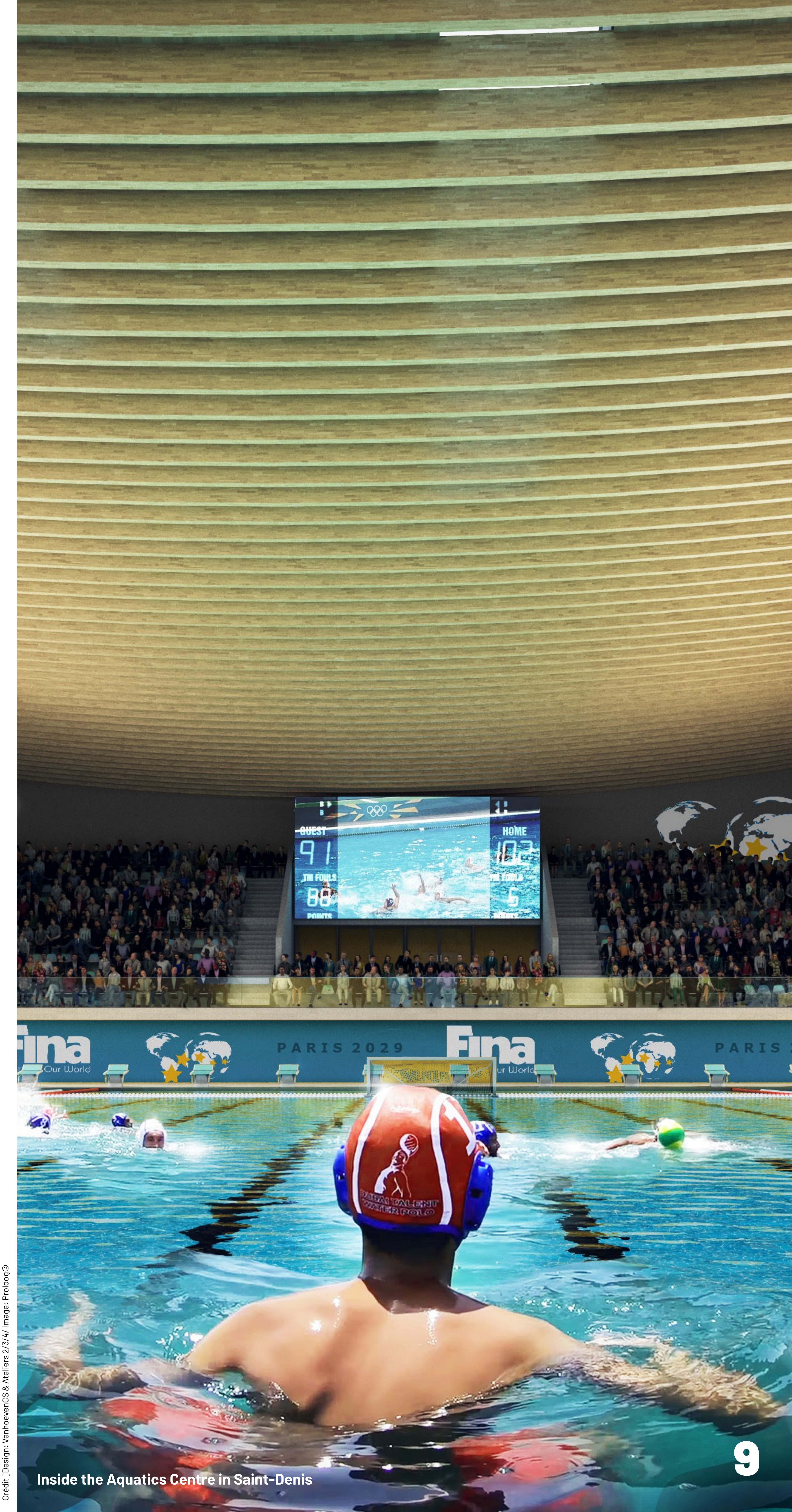


A NEW OLYMPIC SWIMMING POOL (AND NOT JUST ANY POOL!)

Linked to the Stade de France by a footbridge over the A1 motorway, the **Aquatics Centre (CAO)** will host artistic swimming, water polo and diving events. Overseen by the Metropole du Grand Paris, the pool is one of a few permanent sports facilities built for Paris 2024. Constructed from bio-sourced materials and fitted with recycled products and a roof made from 100% French timber, it is a shining example of French expertise.

Once the Games are over, it will be used mainly by the local community, as well as for training sessions by local sports organisations and a national diving centre by the French Swimming Federation.

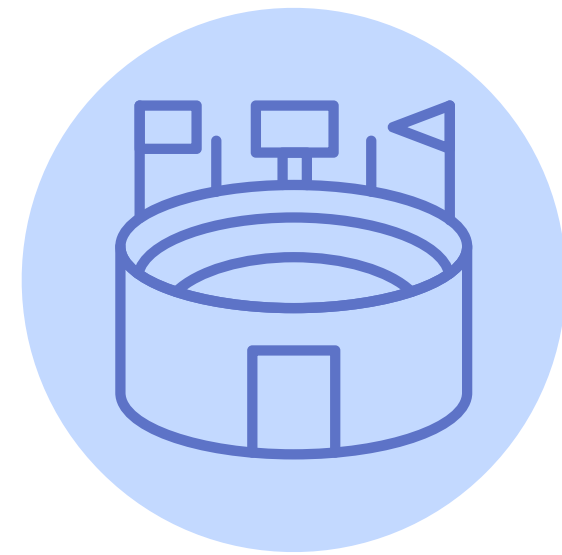

THE FIRST DEDICATED PARASPORT HUB

The **Metropolitan Inclusive Sports Hub (PRISME)** in Bobigny is a new parasports facility built on the La Motte Departmental Stadium site. The only one of its kind in Europe, it was commissioned by the Seine-Saint-Denis Departmental Council and will open to the public in October. A Paris 2024 handball training venue, it covers an area of 15,000 sq.m and is equipped with spaces for climbing, dojo, balneotherapy, boccia, weight training, multi-sports, and other activities.

A NEW ARENA IN NORTHEAST PARIS

The **Adidas Arena**, a new Greater Paris venue and one of the largest purpose-built for Paris 2024 will create a lasting legacy for people living in the capital's La Chapelle district. It opens in early May and will host four Paris 2024 events: badminton, rhythmic gymnastics, para-badminton and para-weightlifting. Since it has a seating capacity for 8,000 people – 9,000 in a concert setup – once the Games are over, it will be used for major sporting events and concerts by leading names in music.

TEMPORARY CLIMBING VENUE

This new **Le Bourget Sports Park** outdoor climbing site was built exclusively for Paris 2024. It will have a seating capacity of 6,000 for ticketholders attending a range of scheduled climbing events. Besides outdoor walls, indoor walls constructed in the park's brand-new gymnasium will double as a training venue for athletes. They will remain in place after the Games for use by residents, including students from neighbouring secondary schools, creating a lasting legacy for the area.

FAN ZONES

Fan zones allow everyone to experience events as if they were sitting in a competition venue. The **Georges Valbon Live Site** in northeast Paris will be open to residents and tourists to watch the action on a giant screen, enjoy entertainment, ascend an 80-metre-high skyliner, and participate in special evening events. Over 700,000 people are expected to celebrate with French medallists at **Club France** in La Villette Park. Towns across Seine-Saint-Denis will also have their fan zones, including in L'Île-Saint-Denis, where the **Africa Station** is set to welcome fans of the African delegations.

CLASSIC EVENTS BRINGING THE REGION TO LIFE

PARIS AIR SHOW (SIAE)

Every two years, the airport runways, exhibition centre and Air and Space Museum of Le Bourget play host to the Paris Air Show. First held in 1909, the SIAE is the leading international event for aeronautics and space industry players. Air enthusiasts from around the world travel to Seine-Saint-Denis throughout the week to admire a display of top-flight aircraft.

Cancelled in 2021 due to the Covid epidemic, the show returned triumphantly in 2023 after a four-year hiatus. More than 290,000 visitors and 2,500 exhibitors attended this 100% trade event. The next show – the 55th – will take place from 16 to 22 June 2025.

CHILDREN'S BOOK AND PRESS FAIR (SLPJ)

This year marks the 40th anniversary of the SLPJ. Held at Paris Montreuil Expo, this show is a must for young readers and adults interested in new works by leading French and international authors and illustrators of children's literature. More than 500 bookshops, libraries and cultural centres are partnering with the event, allowing everyone to stock their bookshelves with works by authors at the show. New in 2023: The show's organisers launched their very first TV channel, broadcasting on DTT and the web with themed programmes, meetings with authors, and show-related news updates.

- **RENCONTRES CHORÉGRAPHIQUES INTERNATIONALES:** Launched in 1990, this leading showcase for emerging choreographers and avant-garde productions confirms Seine-Saint-Denis as a hub for innovative artistic expression.
- **AFRICOLOR:** Africolor has been celebrating African and Afro-diasporic music since 1989, holding up a lyrical mirror to the cultural diversity of Seine-Saint-Denis.
- **BANLIEUES BLEUES:** A jazz and world music festival, Banlieues Bleues spotlights improvised music and brings creative energy to a global audience.
- **VILLES DES MUSIQUES DU MONDE:** This annual festival showcasing the cultural diversity of Seine-Saint-Denis takes us on a musical journey around the world.
- **FESTIVAL DE SAINT-DENIS:** One of the world's leading classical music festivals, the Festival de Saint-Denis is held in the Basilica of Saint-Denis and other historical venues around town - perfect settings for world-class concerts!
- **MULTITUDE:** The Seine-Saint-Denis intercultural biennale celebrates fashion, music and good food. Supported by the département, it is a must-see showcase for world cultures, helping bring together people from all backgrounds. The next event will be held in 2025.

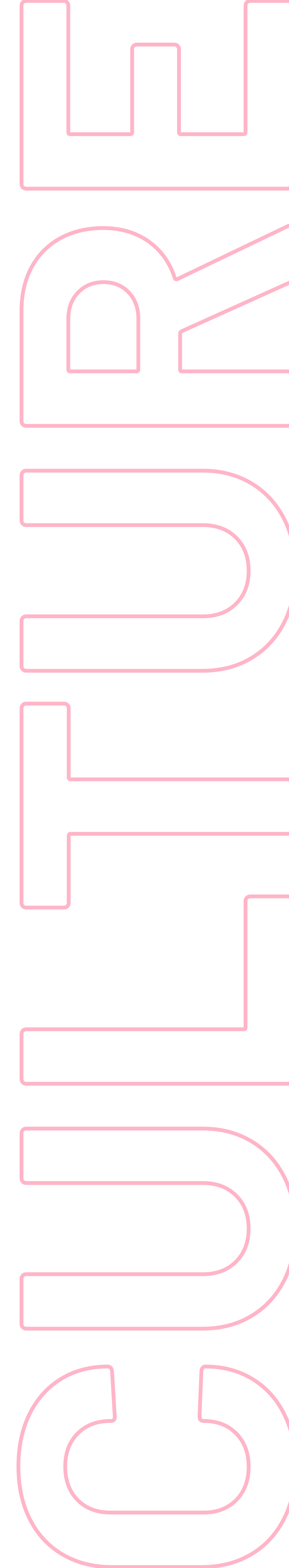

From text-based theatre to contemporary dance, Seine-Saint-Denis is a breeding ground for artistic creation in various visual forms. Performed in venues across the region, from the **MC93** in Bobigny to the **Théâtre Public de Montreuil, La Commune** in Aubervilliers, the **Théâtre Gérard Philippe** in Saint-Denis, the **Théâtre Louis Aragon** in Tremblay-en-France, **La Poudrerie** in Sevrans, **Houdremont/La Maison des Jonglages** in La Courneuve, **L'Espace 1789** in Saint-Ouen, the **CN D** in Pantin, the **Académie Fratellini** in Saint-Denis and the **Zingaro equestrian theatre** in Aubervilliers, they create a one-of-a-kind artistic environment.

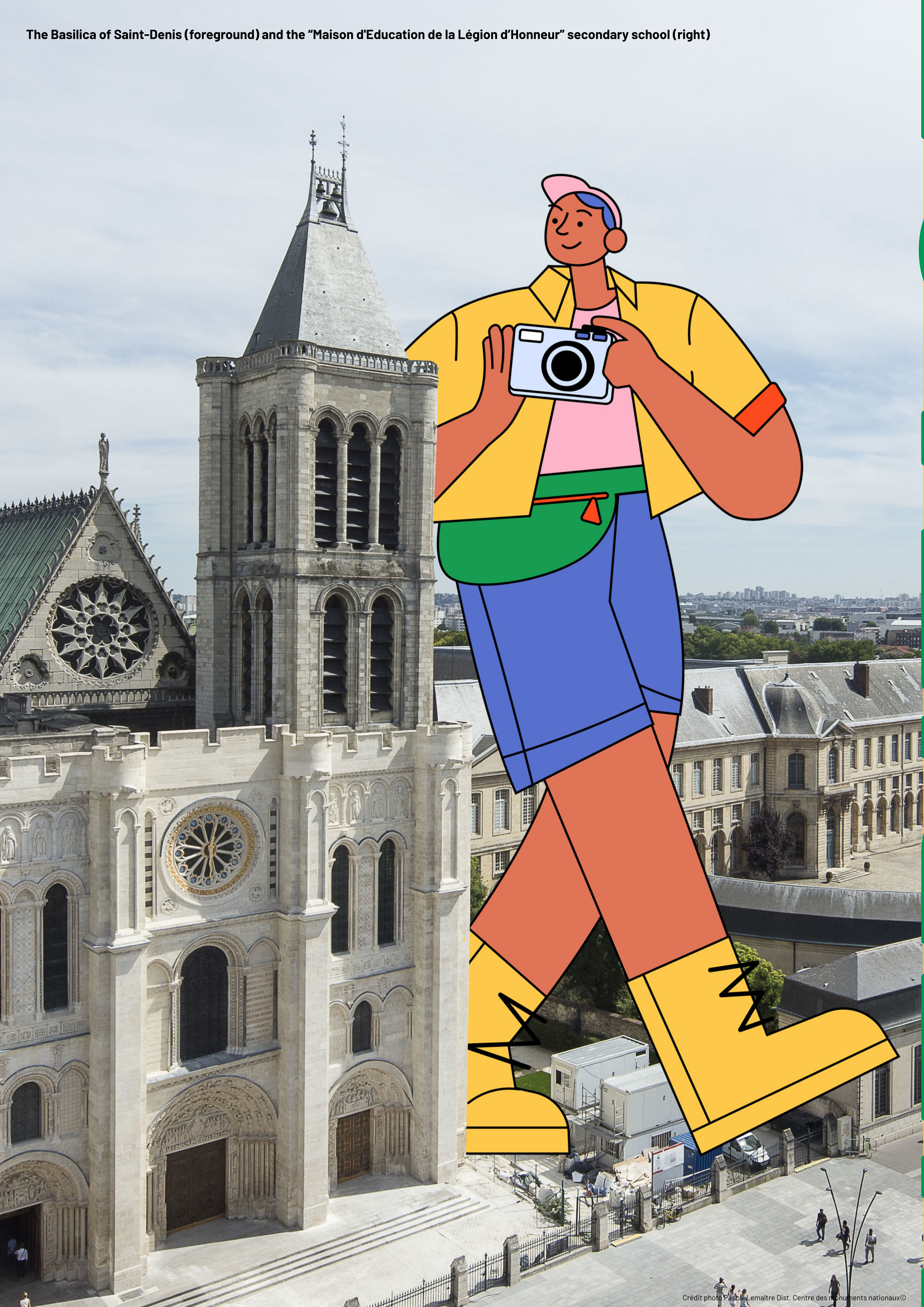

ON THE HERITAGE TRAIL IN SEINE-SAINT-DENIS

Seine-Saint-Denis is packed with **architectural gems**. World-famous or under-the-radar, its buildings never fail to impress. From the celebrated basilica cathedral of Saint-Denis to Auguste Perret's century-old church of Notre-Dame du Raincy, join us on a **whirlwind tour of the joys** awaiting visitors in Seine-Saint-Denis.

SEINE-SAINT-DENIS TOURISME HERITAGE

BASILICA OF SAINT-DENIS

The final resting place of the kings and queens of France, the Basilica of Saint-Denis is one of the birthplaces of Gothic art. Recognised as a cathedral since 1966, it houses the tombs of France's most famous kings, queens, princes and princesses, including Dagobert, Clovis, François I and Catherine de Medici.

New: The non-profit responsible for rebuilding the basilica's spire, Suivez la flèche, will start work on its reconstruction in June 2024. The public can view the restoration works and learn more about the reconstruction on tours led by craftworkers from early 2025. Stephen Dean's 15-metre-high suspended installation, Crescendo, will also be displayed in the basilica until September.

THE FLEA MARKET OF PARIS SAINT-OUEN

The world's largest antique market, the Puces de Paris Saint-Ouen has become a must for international visitors to Paris in recent decades. Whether you're a seasoned art enthusiast or a bargain hunter, enjoy a stroll through the neighbourhood's narrow streets as you browse its store windows, cafés and exhibitions.

New: The annual Festival at Paris St-Ouen Flea Market is usually held in early October. Open to all, the programme includes activities, tastings and exhibitions.

GARDEN CITIES

Seine-Saint-Denis is a densely populated urban area. Almost a century ago, its residential districts were planted with lush green spaces to allow nature and residents to thrive. More commonly known as "garden cities", these seven new neighbourhoods - Bagnolet, Drancy, Epinay-sur-Seine, la Courneuve, le Pré-Saint-Gervais, Villetaneuse and Stains - are now a familiar sight in Seine-Saint-Denis.

New: The Garden Cities Spring Festival is back in 2024. A chance for everyone to learn what Garden Cities are all about on a visit or heritage walk led by enthusiastic guides, the thirteenth festival will be held next May.

NATIONAL ARCHIVES AT PIERREFITTE-SUR-SEINE

Initially based in the chic Marais district in Paris, the French National Archives moved some of its collection to Pierrefitte-sur-Seine in 2013 to give archivists more space to better conserve the documents. Pierrefitte-sur-Seine was chosen because it lies just kilometres from France's largest airport, Roissy-Charles-de-Gaulle, putting this valuable resource within easy reach of international researchers and the public.

New: The Pierrefitte site celebrated its tenth anniversary in 2023 by hosting various events, including "Archives Through Time", an exhibition exploring archive history from Antiquity to the present day, timed to coincide with the 2023 European Heritage Days.

PAUL ELUARD ART AND HISTORY MUSEUM

The Paul Eluard Museum of Art and History in Saint-Denis opened to the public in May 1981 in buildings once occupied by a Carmelite convent. The museum's collections explore subjects including "The Siege and History of the Paris Commune", "Medieval Archaeology", "The Carmelite Convent", and "War in the 19th and 20th Centuries", along with works that shed light on the life of poet Paul Eluard, in the Louis XV Pavilion.

New: Monthly public guided tours of the collections and workshops.

CHURCH NOTRE-DAME DU RAINCY

A landmark of modern architecture, the church Notre-Dame du Raincy was the first building in France built entirely from concrete by the Perret brothers. Nicknamed "The Sainte-Chapelle in Reinforced Concrete" by Le Corbusier, it was listed as a historic monument in 1966.

New: Notre-Dame-de-la-Consolation celebrated its one-hundredth anniversary in 2023. Its 43-metre-high spire and bell tower were restored to mark the occasion as part of an extensive conservation programme. Le Raincy church is entering old age in style.

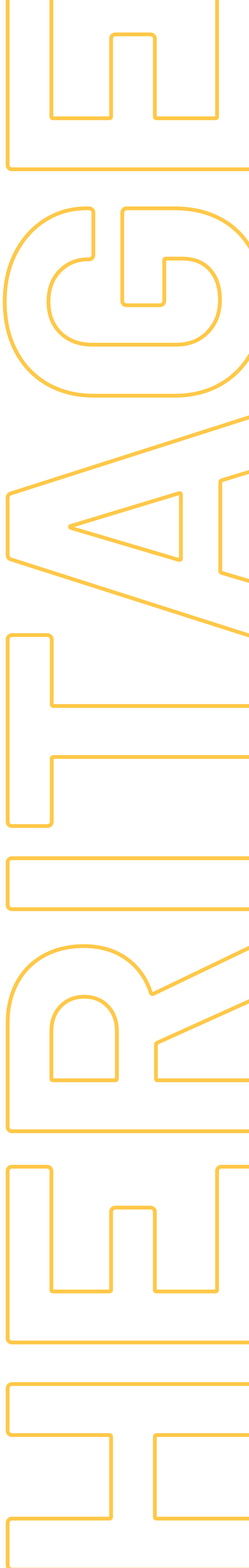

FORMER DEPORTATION STATION, NOW A MEMORIAL

The former Bobigny deportation station opened to the public in early January 2023. Following a two-year renovation, this historic site, built in the 1930s and used for the mass deportation of French Jews during the Second World War, offers everyone an opportunity to embark on an educational journey of remembrance.

In mid-July 2023, the former deportation station reopened as a memorial in the presence of government representatives and death camp survivors to commemorate the eightieth anniversary of the departure of Convoy 57, the first convoy of deportees to Auschwitz-Birkenau.

Following its historic inauguration, the memorial is now open to the public. Guided tours of the site will be organised throughout 2024, along with an extensive programme of events, including a concert by composer Elios Azoulay in March and a lecture by historian Serge Klarsfeld in April. Other events will be announced shortly.

DRANCY SHOAH MEMORIAL

The Drancy Shoah Memorial opened just over a decade ago opposite the Cité de la Muette, where French Jews were interned and regrouped before being deported to concentration camps in Poland and Germany.

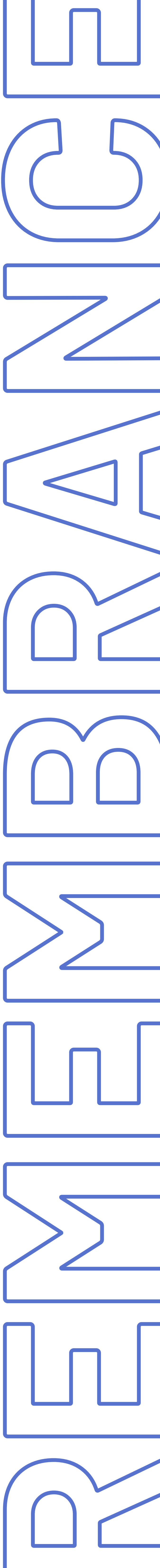
Designed by Swiss architect Roger Diener, the Shoah Memorial is active in teaching and cultural mediation. It uses testimonies, archive documents and period photographs to give visitors an insight into the Cité de la Muette and its role in the deportation of French Jews during this dark chapter in the nation's history.

The exhibition on Shoah survivor Ginette Kolinka will be extended into 2024, as will an exhibition on current events, "Paris 1924-2024: sport, mirror of society", which explores a century of Olympic Games through the issues of prejudice and discrimination.

ROMAINVILLE FORT: SOON A NATIONAL MEMORIAL TO WOMEN RESISTANCE MEMBERS AND DEPORTEES?

This place of commemoration in the town of Les Lilas was the first internment camp set up by the Nazis in France. More than 7,000 people were imprisoned here.

Between 1940 and 1944, Romainville Fort was used mainly to detain women members of the Resistance before they were deported to concentration camps, including Ravensbrück in Germany and Birkenau in Poland. In 2023, extensive conservation work was carried out on this symbolically important site, previously closed to the public, including graffiti in Block 17.

Between now and 2025, this historic site will be transformed into a brand-new neighbourhood with amenities, including sports facilities and living spaces. The Fort will also be open to the public and include a memorial dedicated to women who joined the Resistance and deportees.

OTHER HISTORIC SITES IN THE REGION

The **Quai aux bestiaux** in Pantin was a freight station serving La Villette abattoirs before being converted into a military site by the Nazis. In April and May 1944, two convoys of women prisoners were sent from Romainville Fort to Ravensbrück. It was not until 15 August that the largest and final convoy of more than 2,500 men and women, mainly Resistance fighters, was despatched following the evacuation of the Romainville camp and Fresnes prison ten days before the liberation of Paris. Although still visible today, few people have heard of the Quai aux bestiaux, which will become a site of remembrance – “Le Quai de la Mémoire” – in early 2028.

Forty-two deportation convoys departed the Drancy camp between 1942 and 1943, most bound for Auschwitz. They left from **Le Bourget’s train stations**, which are located close to each other in Drancy and form a single railway complex – another stark reminder of this dark chapter in French history. Renovated more than 15 years ago, Le Bourget-Drancy station is now served by the RER B line and used by more than 10 million passengers annually.

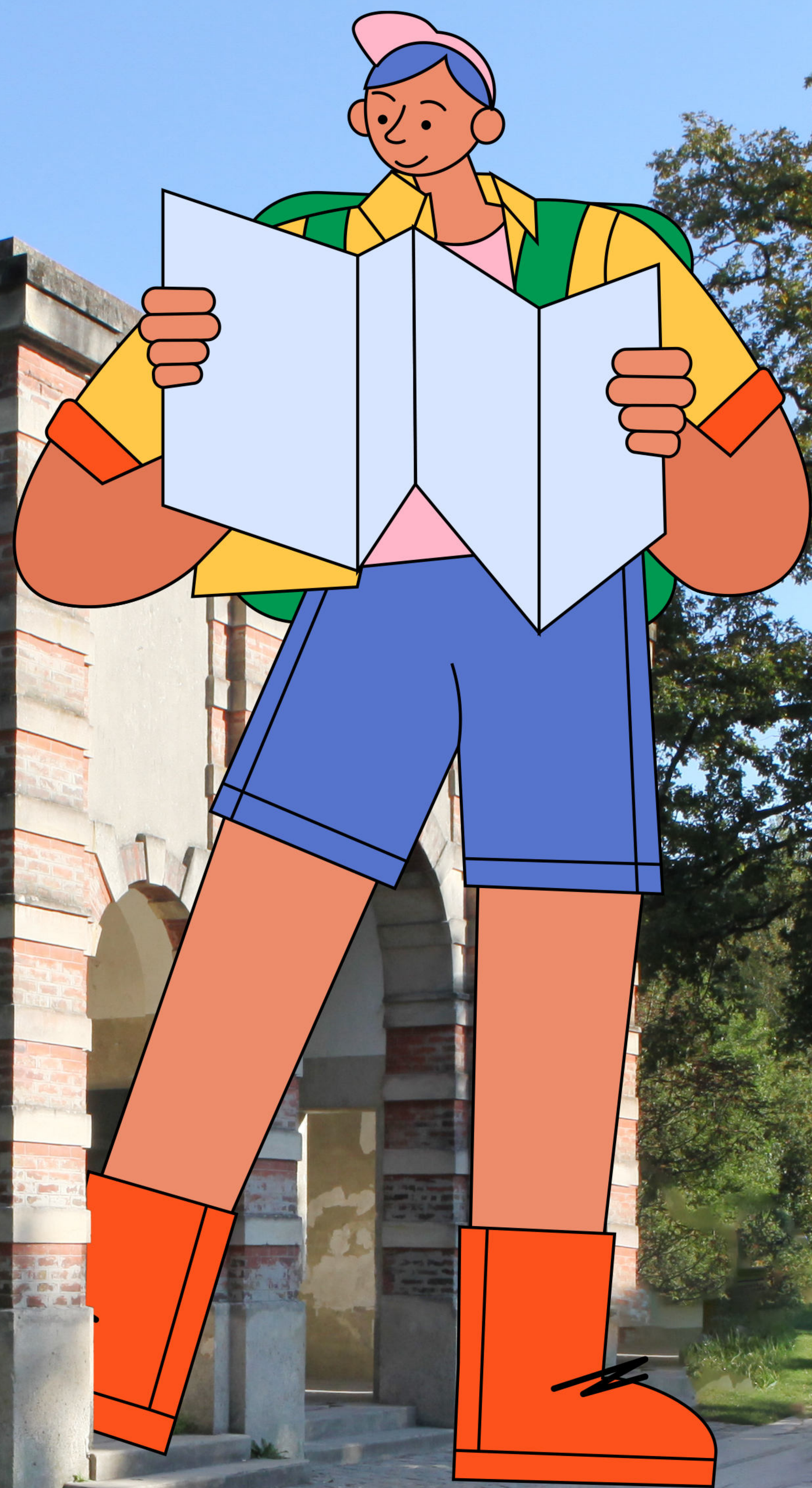

URBAN FARMS: A MODERN NECESSITY

Seine-Saint-Denis was once prime agricultural land known as the "breadbasket of Paris" because it supplied the capital with fresh produce. Now better known for its diverse built environment, the result of decades of intense urbanisation, it still has pockets of greenery, some of which have been turned into urban farms. These include **Zone Sensible**, an eye-opening farm in the middle of a Saint-Denis neighbourhood; the **Cité Maraîchère de Romainville**, France's first vertical farm in a residential area; and **Les Murs à pêches**, where peaches were farmed in the hills above Montreuil.

PARKS AS FAR AS THE EYE CAN SEE

Eight. This is the number of parks in Seine-Saint-Denis. That's pretty good going for one of the smallest départements in France! They include the **Georges-Valbon Departmental Park** (the "Central Park" of the Paris region) and **La Poudrerie Park**, both Natura 2000 sites; **La Haute-Île Park**, specialising in wildlife observation; and **La Bergère Park** in Bobigny on the banks of the Ourcq Canal, where visitors enjoy a breath of fresh air in nature just a stone's throw from the city.

These parks host countless different activities throughout the year, many in summer.

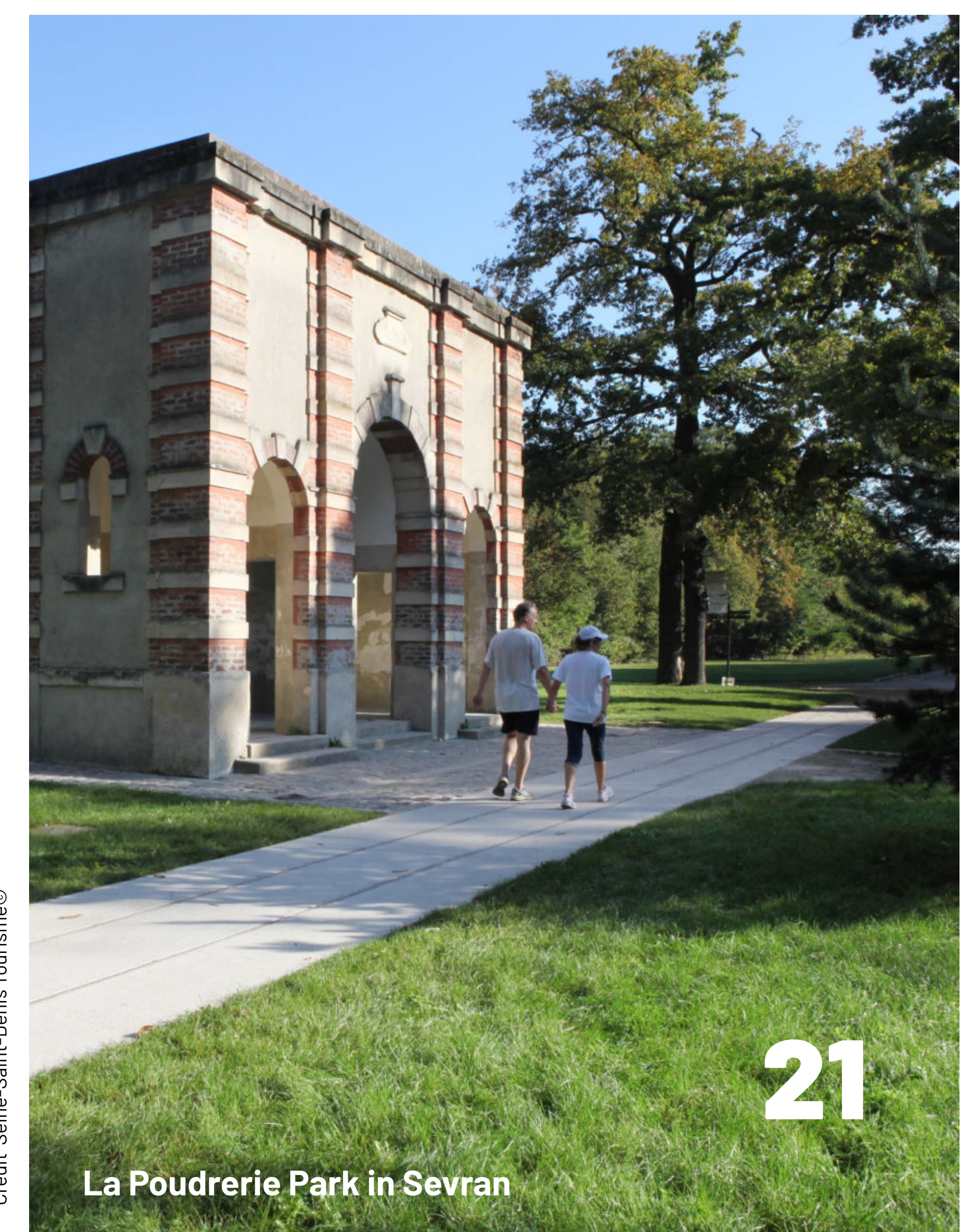

WATERWAYS AT THE HEART OF SEINE-SAINT-DENIS

Explore the landscape of Seine-Saint-Denis by water. Its waterways have been put to many different uses over the centuries and they have always played a vital role in local life.

- **OURCQ CANAL:** over 96 kilometres long, this canal passes through most towns in Seine-Saint-Denis. It celebrated its bicentenary in 2022 and is still used to transport freight, although visitors can now explore local culture on special cruises (see page 6 - Summer on the Canal).

- **SAINT-DENIS CANAL:** this canal celebrated its bicentenary in 2021 and connects La Villette Park to Saint-Denis. In 2024, this six-kilometre-long canal with seven locks will be awarded "Olympic canal" status and play an essential role in Paris 2024.

- **THE MARNE:** this river, which runs southeast of the département, boasts countless must-visit attractions. The Cap sur la Marne festival is a great way to explore these waterways: held from May to October, it is one of the highlights in the local calendar and includes the Grande Aventure festival from 8 to 9 June.

- **THE SEINE:** this river, which also winds across the region, adds a picturesque touch to the towns it passes through - Saint-Ouen, Saint-Denis, L'Île-Saint-Denis and Epinay-sur-Seine. The Athletes' Village is located on its banks, helping set the scene for Paris 2024.



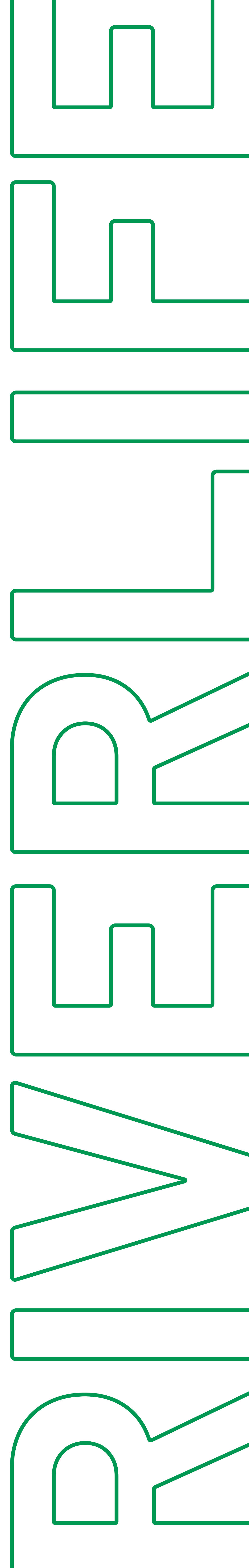

TRANSFORMING BROWNFIELD SITES INTO BUSINESS INCUBATORS

Seine-Saint-Denis and northeast Paris were important centres of industry in the 19th and 20th centuries during France's two significant periods of industrialisation. Many of these brownfield sites have now been transformed by craftworkers, giving them a new lease of life. **L'Orfèverie** in Saint-Denis, once home to the Christofle factory of excellence, **La Briche Foraine**, also in Saint-Denis, in a former scrap metal workshop, and the **Villa Mais d'Ici** in Aubervilliers, are among several sites awarded "artists' residence" status.

"ARTISAN DU TOURISME" LABEL

The Chambre des Métiers et de l'Artisanat, the Département de la Seine-Saint-Denis, and Seine-Saint-Denis Tourisme launched the "**Artisan du Tourisme**" label in December 2023 to promote the region's culinary and artistic trades. Twenty-one craftworkers have been awarded the label, with more to come this spring.

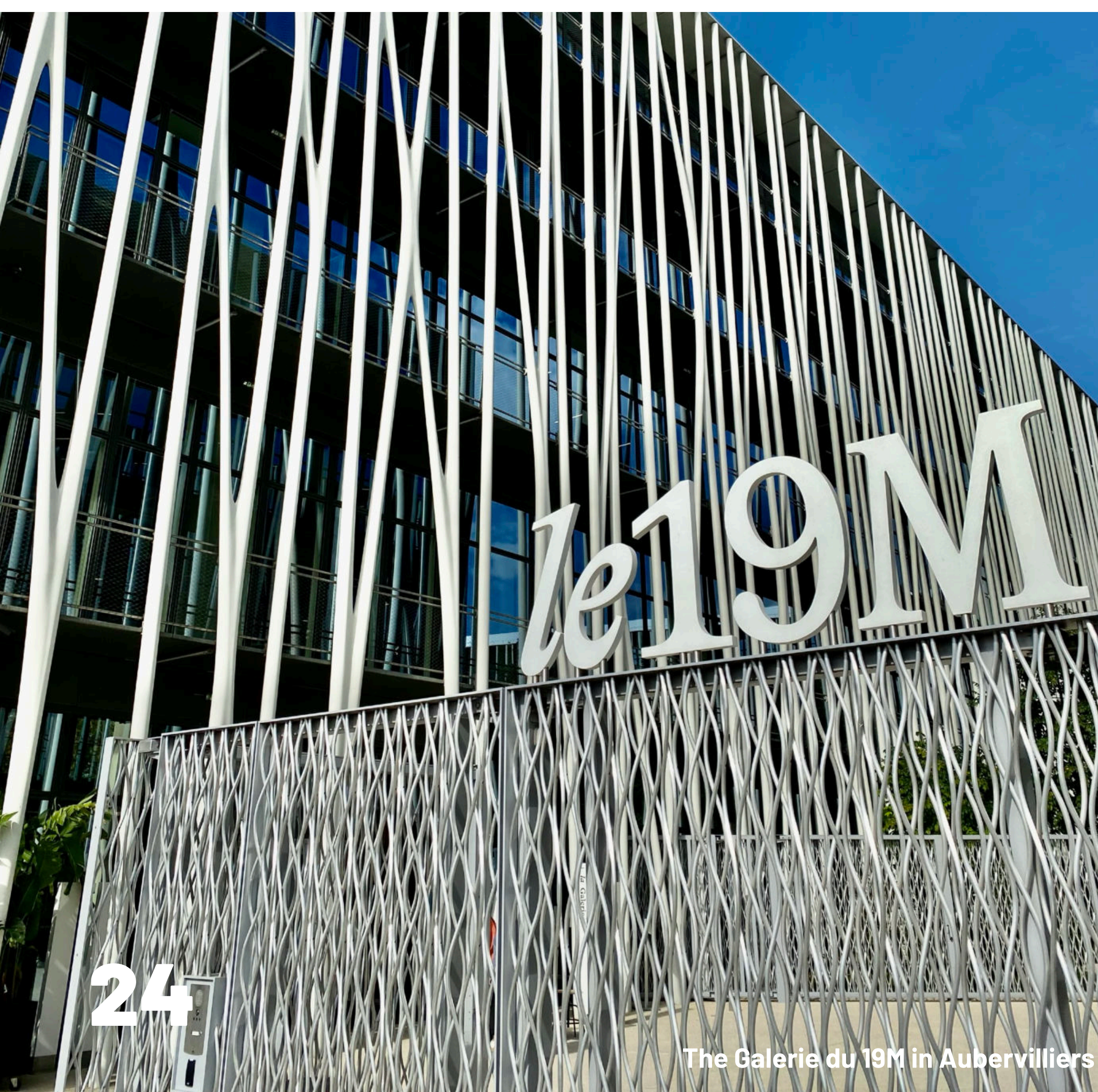
A REGION WITH EXCEPTIONAL KNOW-HOW

Besides vibrant business incubators, many other arts and crafts professionals live and work in Seine-Saint-Denis.

- **CRAFTWORKERS AND THEIR MATERIALS:** Founders, engravers, stained-glass artists, brazers and others hold up a mirror to the region's creative industries. These centuries-old trades depend on the availability of vital materials – metal, terracotta, ceramics and glass – to manufacture objets d'art. The range of materials used in Seine-Saint-Denis is even wider. Some are exceedingly rare, like bronze, the speciality of the **Chapon art foundry** in Bobigny, exotic wood, worked by the **sons of J. Georges** in Bagnolet, stained glass, made by **Gaëlle Dasonville**, and countless others worked by craftsmen and women in the **art workshops of the Rmn-Grand Palais**.
- **DESIGNERS OF EVERYDAY OBJECTS (OR ALMOST!)** Other craftworkers specialise in furniture restoration, like **Benoît Marcu** in Saint-Ouen, or make luxury lamps, such as **Maison Charles** in Aubervilliers, which has been in business for over a century. Even ordinary everyday objects deserve a new (and sometimes luxurious) lease of life!
- **LUXURY HOUSES:** While many leading luxury names are based in the capital's most highly prized neighbourhoods, some have located their design studios in Seine-Saint-Denis. **Galerie du 19M** is a space for exhibitions, workshops and talks on fashion created by Chanel in Aubervilliers and designed by architect Rudy Ricciotti; the **Ateliers de maroquinerie Hermès**, which specialises in leather goods, has been based in Pantin for over 30 years; and **Bonzini**, France's leading football table manufacturer, and **Lit National**, maker of haute couture beds, are among the brightest stars in the local craft galaxy.
- **LIVE PERFORMANCE SPECIALISTS:** Where would music, theatre and film be without sets and costumes? Several craftsmen and women in the entertainment industry have made the leap and moved to the region to create unique pieces for their customers. **Alaric Chagnard**, for example, creates original stage masks in his workshop in Pantin, while **Jipanco** produces sets for the capital's most prestigious theatres.
- **ONE-OF-A-KIND TRAINING:** Being a craftsman or woman also means training in prestigious places of learning. **Les Compagnons du Devoir et du Tour de France** in Pantin and the **Institut National du Patrimoine**, in a former match factory in Aubervilliers, are among the leading names in training in Seine-Saint-Denis.

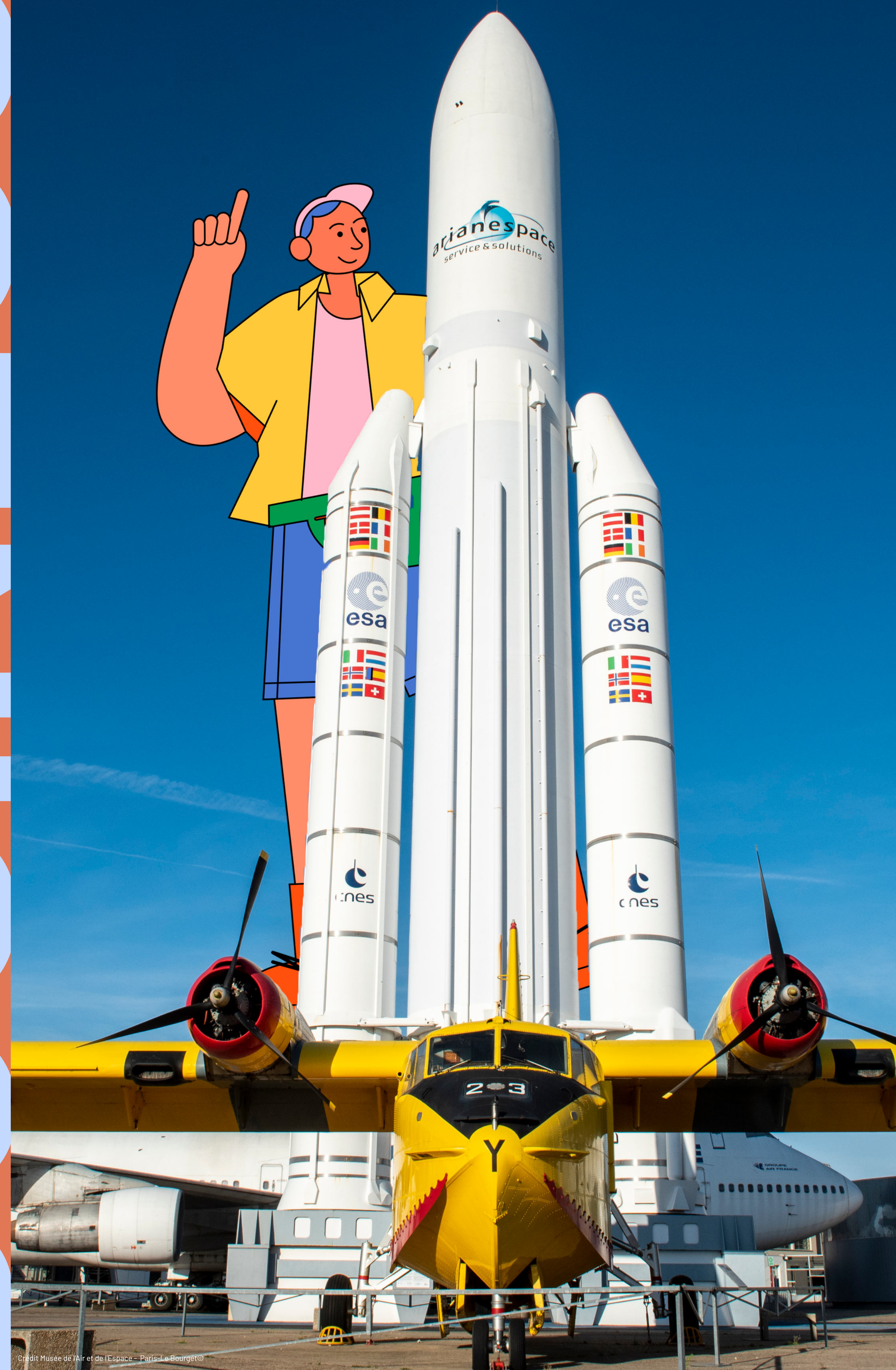

EXCELLENT TRANSPORT LINKS

Seine-Saint-Denis is strategically located at the heart of Europe and Greater Paris. Served by a dense transport network, its train stations, motorways, and two international airports – **Roissy Charles-de-Gaulle** and **Paris-Le Bourget** – are highly connected, making travel to international events easy. Over the last few years, Seine-Saint-Denis and northeast Paris have emerged as hubs for meetings, conferences, congresses, seminars, and corporate events.

FLAGSHIP VENUES FOR A WIDE RANGE OF EVENTS

Equipped with modular spaces and state-of-the-art facilities, the **Villepinte** and **Le Bourget** exhibition centres can be hired for large-scale events, while iconic, multi-purpose venues such as the **Stade de France**, **Les Docks de Paris**, **La Grande Halle de la Villette**, **La Cité des Sciences Convention Centre**, the **Paris Event Center** and **Paris Montreuil Expo** also lend themselves to a complete range of business events.

THIRD-PARTY AND CULTURAL SPACES

Besides a portfolio of conventional venues, organisers of special events can choose from unique third-party and cultural spaces in Seine-Saint-Denis and northeast Paris. The **Cité Fertile**, the **6b**, the **Air and Space Museum** and the **CN D** add an original, creative or community-focused touch to corporate meetings and events.

SPORTS VENUES FOR TEAM-BUILDING

Are you organising a team-building exercise? A wide choice of sport and leisure venues are available for hire in Seine-Saint-Denis, from the **Sand Fabrik**, a sand sports facility in Pantin, to **go-karting** in Aulnay-sous-Bois, **Climb Up** in Aubervilliers, one of the world's largest indoor climbing centres and the **Red Star FC** training stadium in the Marville Departmental Park. These one-of-a-kind venues are ideal for original team-building sessions.

LATEST DEVELOPMENTS

Construction projects continue to shape the local skyline in the run-up to the 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games. The vast **H4 Hotel Wyndham Paris Pleyel** and its conference centre in Saint-Denis will bolster the region's capacity and appeal, as will projects including **COMMUNALE** in Saint-Ouen and the **Arena Grand Paris** in Tremblay-en-France, which add a new dimension to the region's portfolio of events venues.

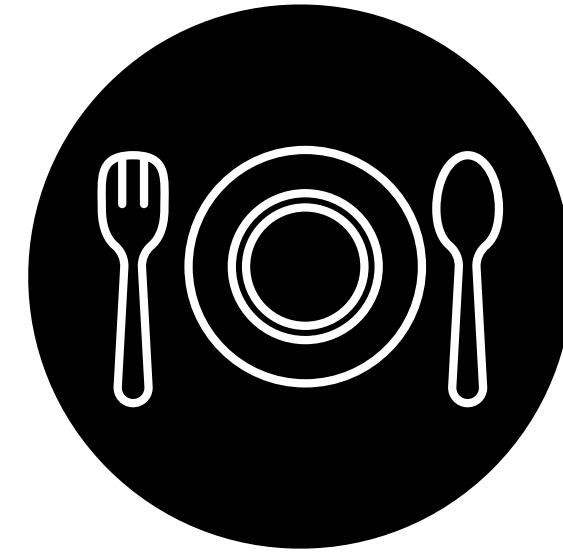

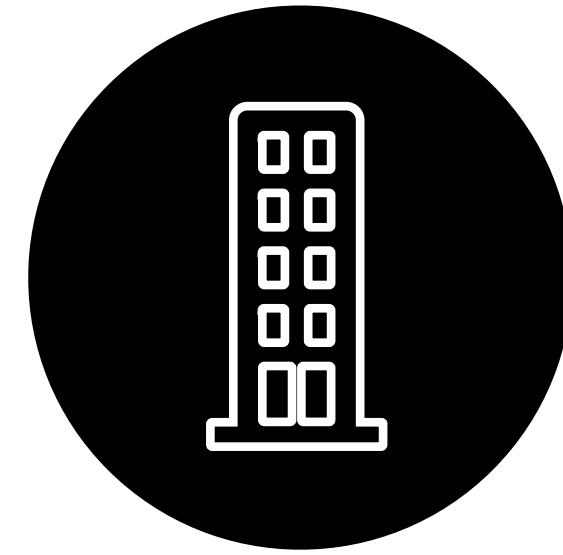

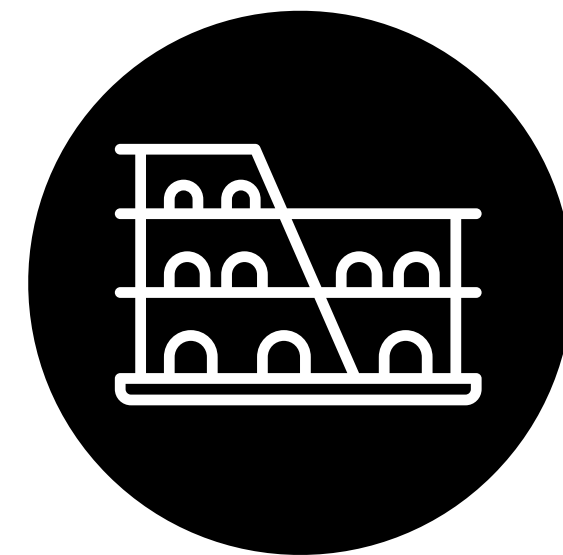
